Geopolitics: The Geography of International Relations Geopolitics is the study of the influences of geographical factors in politics and the relationships between different political actors, particularly sovereign states, as well as de-

facto states and subnational geopolitical entities. Within the context of international relations, geopolitics provides a framework for studying foreign policy, as well as for explaining and predicting the behaviors of international political actors based on geographical variables.
